640 responses collected from August 30 to September 8, 2019

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Introduction

The *El Goonish Shive* community is spread far and thin, as there exists no centralized hub for discussion and congregation. As a result, it is hard to get a complete picture of the varied tastes and opinions of this fandom's members, and nothing was known about our demographics outside of guesswork.


This survey was inspired by the <u>Perfectly Generic Podcast Homestuck community survey</u>, which was launched by Kate Mitchel in August 2019 to get an impression of the demographics of the *Homestuck* fandom. Our own fandom may be a bit smaller, but no less important to many of us.






1.4 Gender identity

Respondents were able to select multiple gender labels, including an "other" label. Only "Female", "Male", and "Nonbinary" were promoted by the survey itself. 636 of the respondents answered this question. A few of these selected both a binary gender and a specification (like "Male; Noncommittal shrug", "Female; Non-binary", and "Male; Occasionally feel genderfluid").



1.5 Sexuality and romantic attraction

Like with gender, respondents were able to select multiple sexuality labels, including an "other" label. Here, nine sexualities were promoted by the survey itself: Straight, gay, bi, ace, pan, lesbian, demi, allo, and questioning. 636 respondents answered this question, though a few did so in a manner that is difficult to plot on a graph.




Eight people specifically identified themselves as gynesexual. Two people specifically identified themselves as androsexual. Four people indicated that they are unsure, but not specifically questioning, with answers such as "???", "*shrug*", "Fucked if I know", and "uncertain but not really questioning, just goin' with the flow."

Romantic attraction had a similar, but slightly more limited set of promoted labels: "Heteroromantic", "Homoromantic", "Biromantic", "Aromantic", "Panromantic", and "Questioning". 626 respondents answered this question, and again a few did so in a manner that is difficult to plot on a graph.





Interestingly, seven people reported to start reading *El Goonish Shive* before Dan began posting it on the Web in 2002. Five of these originate from the United States. 


633 people reviewed *El Goonish Shive* on a 1-5 scale, and the results were particularly positive. Almost 70% of the people willing to fill out the survey gave the webcomic a 5/5, and practically no one rated it lower than a 3. The average rating is a 4.66.




Who is your favorite "Main 8" character in El Goonish Shive?














Only 398 people felt able to select a least favorite arc. Nearly half of these people selected "El Goonish Shive", the first storyline that introduced seven of the eight main characters, and included several non-canon chapters like "Introductions" and "April Fools Week".

With regards to people's favorite artstyle, there is a clear bias in favor of colored storylines such as "Sister II" and "Squirrel Prophet". In general, however, people appreciate the art of more recent arcs over that of older arcs, and the most recent storyline "The New World" received a clear plurality of votes.




Which arc of El Goonish Shive features your favorite artwork or artstyle?

5. Community

5.1 Identity


The survey included several questions aimed directly at the LGBT subcommunity, and how *El Goonish Shive* has allowed people to explore their own identity. There was a bit of bias going on in asking these questions, as the questions were largely based on the incorrect notion that the majority of *El Goonish Shive* readers are some shade of transgender. Regardless, the results do show that the lives of a large portion of the community have been quite affected by *El Goonish Shive* and its community.

1 = full no, 2 = full yes.




Did El Goonish Shive help you figure out your (gender) identity?

Did El Goonish Shive the community help you figure out your (gender) identity?




El Goonish Shive is also in large part a furry webcomic, though the story has not explored this subject in much depth recently.





Have you read El Goonish Shive fanfiction?




Do you enjoy NSFW El Goonish Shive fanworks?



5.3 Platforms



Do you support Dan on Patreon?




Several respondents specifically noted that they primarily lurk the *EGS* subreddit, without posting. Three respondents said they were highly surprised to find out about the existence of the *EGS* Discord server, and were interested in joining it.

Individual respondents also mentioned the TVTropes forum, Archive of Our Own, Quora, and Tumblr as hubs for the *El Goonish Shive* community.

6. Related works

Several webcomics, manga, and other media covers similar themes as *El Goonish Shive*, be it characterdriven high school kids forming their own identity, sci-fi and fantasy in an urban setting, geeky calculations and analysis, or of course LGBT and gender bender storylines. The survey asked respondents about a few specific popular webcomics:




Have you read any of these webcomics?

Another open question was posed with regards to favorite "queer media". This question got an enormous variation in responses, ranging from *Ranma ½* to *Legend of Korra*, from *Sense8* to *Some Like It Hot*, and from *RuPaul's Drag Race* to *My Lesbian Experience with Loneliness*. The most common responses seem to have been:

- Rain (11 people)
- Homestuck (7 people)
- Bloom Into You (4 people)

I do not feel prepared to dig through all of the responses and compile them as I did for "favorite webcomic." However, I am happy to make the raw list of responses available.

Moreover, I want to apologize for asking such a vague question, which was strongly based on my own experience on Twitter and the *El Goonish Shive* and *Rain* Discord servers. The question confused and possibly even offended a part of the people who responded to it, and I should have put more thought into it.

Lastly, the majority of the community does not actively read gender bender manga

7. Messages from the community

One open question we asked at the end of the survey was "Do you have any thoughts on *El Goonish Shive* you want to share?" This question received 218 responses. This section contains a selection of messages from the community. A full list of these responses will also be made available.

- A sketch doesn't cut it, we want the Demonic Duck back. Especially since we last saw him in a car accident
- Amazing evolution over the years. Keep up the good work.
- As good as the comic is, what really impresses me is Dan's work ethic. He gets it out on time, every time, except when he doesn't. When he doesn't, he drops us a line, lets us know. Sometimes a story is so compelling I'll find myself checking throughout the day and it's irritating when I don't know when or even *if* a new comic is going to show up. With Dan, I always know.
- Ashley is the best and I hope she continues to feature prominently. This is such a great comic!
- Back when i was still in school, I wasn't very popular, and absolutely hated it. EGS actually made me look forward to Monday, rather than dread it.
- Change up the character dynamics more!
- Dan is a golden god.
- Dan is surprisingly cool with some of the nonsense the fandom provides
- dan needs a buffer and a vacation
- dan pls gimme dat font
- Definitely transgender nirvana.
- EGS has meant so much to me over the years, and has some of the most affecting moments of any webcomic I follow. More than once I've teared up reading it, or punched the air in triumph, or wanted to hug a character SO BADLY... And Tedd's 'there's a NAME for it', Susan's 'is the only reason because I view men as the DEFAULT', and the strip I said was my favourite mean SO MUCH to me personally... Dan has created a wonderful thing, and I am SO GLAD it's still around all these years later, and has grown so much into what it is today.
- EGS has raised questions about my gender and gender identity, but I'm no closer to an answer than when those questions were first raised.
- egs is rough around the edges in exactly the way i needed
- El Goonish Shive makes me feel warm and fuzzy inside. It really holds a special place in my heart <3

- I just want kitty and felix to come back tbh. Who cares about the main cast let me see more adventures of the (seemingly in denial) lesbian catgirl-fan and her trans gf

- I particularly like the way the exceptionally "nice" characters provide a support system for each other that provides an in-comic justification for how their adventures haven't left them all non-functional from PTSD.
- i read it for the positivity. the genderbending and overthought magic system are just bonuses.
- I really appreciate that you have a version of it where you can have side stories and non canon fun.
- I really appreciate the use of the extraordinary being the norm. As it backlights the normalicy of character development and people being people and really brings it to the forefront. Reminds me of Sir Terry Pratchett.
- I think EGS handles gender issues quite deftly, but I don't really consider it to be wholly ABOUT gender issues...
- I think it is a fantastic exploration of LGBTQ+ themes through a fantasy background, because of how many issues it addresses.
- I think it's cool.
- I'm a psychiatrist in training and I learnt a lot about (issues with) gender/sexuality/... from this comic thank you!
- It's amazing. Though it didn't help me with my own gender identity, EGS and QC certainly helped prep me for when my sister came out and then came out as trans. Sam's struggle is real.
- It's been a mid-level enjoyable ride. Moves like molasses especially with different story lines and a 'uge cast. I find some of the panels overly grounded in exposition or "covering bases" but I'm not a comic writer so what do I know. There comic does have a lot of heart though. Characters feel like they come from a genuine place even if they mature and learn at a glacial pace for to comic's scope. As a hetero cis boy I read this comic and kinda just confronted and learned bits and pieces about expressions of sexualities, identities, and even a little trauma mitigation by personality. I have genuinely loved this comic in the past even if I've let that flame ember.

8. Conclusion and credits

I am incredibly happy with all the positive responses I have gotten for this survey, and how many people were willing to fill it in! 640 people is only a fraction of all *El Goonish Shive* fans (Dan has more than twice as many Patreon supporters), but it is still an enormous number of people. And it is quite a diverse crowd, though it does seem to consist predominantly out of white USians.

It is good to see that people feel like the webcomic and its art has been consistently improving over the years, and that fan feel that the webcomic is at its height of quality, at least since Grace' birthday party. All of the main characters are much beloved, and fans seem to dislike almost exclusively villains (though I will never understand the Some Guy hate personally).

I hope this survey will give everyone a better idea of where to find community and what similar works there are to read and watch and experience.

We have gotten a lot of great feedback from the survey, and we will definitely apply it all for future surveys, be they for the *El Goonish Shive* community next year or for a different webcomic.
